## SAT



The **SAT** is a test that helps determine where students can enroll in college, what financial assistance they may earn, or what path they take in the military.

## PSAT



The **PSAT** is a practice test that helps your child prepare for the SAT.

## Did you Know?



Many colleges and universities include a minimum SAT score in their admissions requirements.



A good SAT score can get your child out of taking certain classes at community colleges and four-year colleges and universities -- saving your family money!



If your child is military-bound, preparing for the SAT will also help him or her prepare for the test that determines acceptance into the military and the type of job he or she will have there.

A strong SAT score can help students show they're ready for a job; qualify for scholarships at technical, two-year, and four-year colleges; get accepted at more colleges and universities; test out of college classes; and have more choices in the military.
