Apprenticeship

Earn and learn! An apprenticeship provides paid on-the-job experience and training in your child's career pathway, and results in a completed Associate's degree or professional certification.

Students complete high school and college coursework, and receive hands-on training with the oversight of a skilled professional.

Military

Serve our country in the Armed Forces. Earn a salary, train for a career, and earn money for college!

Technical School

A technical school helps your child prepare for a specific career or trade. Sometimes called an occupational or vocational school, technical school usually requires one to two years after high school. Graduates earn a certificate or credential that proves they have mastered the knowledge and skills required for careers in everything from acupuncture to veterinary technician.

Community College

Earn a certificate or two-year Associate's Degree, with one to two years of study after high school. Earn 32% more income over your lifetime!

Four-Year College or University

Earn a Bachelor's degree, with an average of four years of study after high school. Earn 74% more income over your lifetime!

Helpful Definitions

Certificate - Demonstrates completion of a short-term technical or career-training program.

Credential - Demonstrates students have developed the knowledge and skills to perform entry-level tasks according to industry-specific requirements

Associate's degree - A two-year degree that prepares students for further study or for specific careers.

Bachelor's degree - A four-year degree in a specified subject.



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
