In accordance with H.B. 1323, Westminster Public Schools has created an annual assessment calendar. The calendar lists the assessments administered throughout the year, the content areas, the grade levels assessed, assessment dates, when results will be available, agency mandating the test, and how the results are used. The district has developed a comprehensive assessment system that challenges students to think critically, apply what they have learn, and gives them the opportunity to demonstrate their skills and knowledge. These assessments include "early warning" features that help diagnose educational problems and lets students, teachers, and parents/guardians know that extra effort is necessary. It also provides reliable and valid information on student and school performance for educators, parents/guardians, and district leaders. The primary purpose of classroom assessments is to enable teachers to make effective instructional adjustments for students on a continual basis. The district monitors the number of assessments students are given annually based on federal, state, and district requirements.
