Adult education programs offer a range of services, which may include:

- adult basic education (math, reading, writing, speaking, and listening)
- adult secondary education (high school equivalency or diploma preparation)
- English Language Instruction
- work-based learning opportunities, such as apprenticeships

Adult education programs are available to individuals that are generally 17 years or older*

- Are not enrolled or required to be enrolled in secondary school
- Do not have a high school diploma or its equivalent
- Want to learn to speak, read, and write the English language
