INAUGURAL POWER OF HOPE AWARD



National Postsecondary Institute (NPSI), 2021

On March 5, 2021, the National Postsecondary Institute (NPSI) and Reach Higher announced the winners of the first-ever Power of Hope Award. This award is designed to recognize school districts that have counselors that engage in leadership roles to implement strategies for college and career success.

The Power of Hope Award focuses upon providing low income and predominantly minority students' access to post-secondary learning opportunities to change students' lives.

"It is time to strategically position counselors as leaders in schools and in districts so they can be an essential part of the educational reform agenda," said Arne Duncan, former Secretary of Education under President Obama.

EXTENDED LEARNING

RESPOND/ RECOVER/ RENEW ACTION PLAN

This spring Hidden Lake High School is offering “Extended Learning” for twelve days after school ends in May. This will allow students to complete courses not completed during the school year.

Our intention is to overcome the impact of COVID-19 on student learning and provide an opportunity for students to continue learning while completing courses on their pathway to graduation.

In cooperation with the school district, Hidden Lake’s plan includes analyzing each student’s transcript and course completion. This will allow for the scheduling of students into cohorts

for those twelve days to maximize each students’ ability to complete courses.

At Hidden Lake, we will follow our current daily schedule in regards to our start and end times. Students will be scheduled into only two courses within a cohort to maximize learning in those content areas. Each class will be 2.5 hours long, within the cohort designed to protect and minimize the effect of COVID-19 while giving students time to complete courses.

The majority of our staff has committed to be part of the Extended Learning providing courses and content to support students. Students that are currently in-person will remain in-person. Remote learners may choose to be in-person or continue in a remote setting. Remote learning will not be available for current in-person learning without administrative approval.

We highly encourage students to take advantage of this opportunity. The school district is using OCVID relief funding to provide this opportunity.

WESTMINSTER HIGH SCHOOL BECOMES VACCINATION SITE

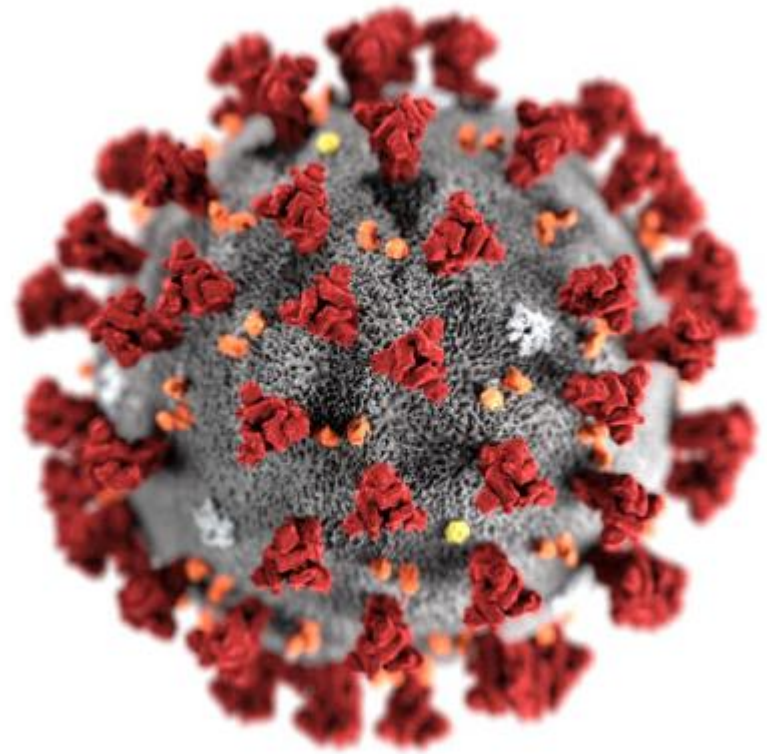
